Handwashing Reminder

Any employee, not just patient care staff, should be using proper hand hygiene. Every employee should be using hand hygiene upon entering a patient's room because it is the most important thing you can do to prevent infections from spreading.

Hand hygiene means washing with soap and water or the use of an alcohol based hand sanitizer.

If hands are not visibly soiled, you can use an alcohol based hand rub. All surfaces should be covered and you should use at least a dime sized dollop of hand solution.

Handwashing should take about 20 to 25 seconds and should be performed as follows:

- Wet hands with warm water, then apply one squirt of soap. Hot water may increase the risk of dermatitis.
- · Vigorously rub together all surfaces of lathered hands.
- Thoroughly rinse hands under a stream of water.
- · Dry hands with a paper towel.

Service Spotlight: Cancer Care

It has come to our attention that many of our own staff members are not aware of the services offered in our facility. Therefore, each month we will feature a "Service Spotlight" in Highlights. This month, we are featuring Cancer Care services offered at Lucas County Health Center.

A cancer diagnosis can be overwhelming and scary. At Lucas County Health Center, we believe providing cancer-related care close to home is an important part of what we do. That is why we are proud to offer a comprehensive program that features state-of-the-art treatment and education, as well as preventive care and early detection.

Early Detection and Prevention

Cancer screenings are exams or medical tests performed when you're healthy and have no signs of illness. They help find cancer early when your chances for successful treatment are the greatest. Early detection and prevention services offered at Lucas County Health Center are:

- Colorectal cancer screening exam (colonoscopy)
- · Clinical breast exam
- · Digital mammography
- · Clinical pelvic exam and pap test
- Human papillomavirus (HPV) testing and vaccine
- · Skin cancer screenings
- Prostate cancer screenings
- Biopsy and diagnostic pathology
- Diagnostic imaging (MRI, CT, Ultrasound, Nuclear Medicine)
- · Laboratory Testing

Chemotherapy and Infusion Center

Our infusion rooms offer state-of-theart medical care in a comfortable and cozy environment. Our knowledgeable staff, including nurses, providers, and pharmacists, is available to answer questions about all aspects of your infusion therapy. Services offered are:

- Pre-medications (i.e. anti-nausea, antiinflammatory)
- · Chemotherapy medications

- IV antibiotic therapy
- · IV immune globulin
- Hydration therapy
- · Anti-rejection medication
- Transfusion of blood products
- · Procuring specimens for lab testing

Surgery

We are proud to partner with a variety of providers to offer surgery-related services, including:

- Surgical cancer tumor/cells removal
- Infusaport Placement
- Long-term IV access procedures
- · Pain management injection therapy
- · Post-surgical hospital care
