Administration Update

We are beginning the next phase of our Facility Master Plan (FMP) this week. The goal of this Programming Phase is to look at our space and determine the needs, budget, and timeline that would be required if we were to build a facility.

During the first phase of the FMP, a new facility build was an option. This option is very expensive - so expensive in fact that we would not be able to borrow the funds to complete a project of this scope as it currently sits. Therefore, the next step (programming) looks at space needs to determine whether a new facility build is within our financial grasp if we analyze areas/departments and build according to our size needs.

We are working to find the best answer for our hospital so we can do what is best for our patients.

Service Focus: Epidural Steroid Injections

Did you know LCHC does Epidural Steroid Injection (ESI) treatments?

Epidural steroids are used to safely and effectively treat chronic neck and back pain. While most patients can cure their pain with rest, physical therapy, anti-inflammatory drugs, and back exercises, for some it is not enough.

By administering a low-dose, long-acting medication, epidural steroids can effectively deliver the anti-inflammatory effect directly to the site of pain. This reduces the dose of medication necessary and increases it's effectiveness.



Relief lasts anywhere from days to months and is an effective treatment for:

- Bulging or herniated discs in the back/neck
- Failed back surgery
- Spinal stenosis
- ...and more!

 Poor grammar, punctuation, and spelling
 Requests personal or sensitive information
 High sense of urgency and/or privacy
 Discusses confidential subjects, like salaries
 - Incentivizes through threat or reward


THINGS TO KNOW:

COVID Vaccine Update: Things To Know

- Lucas County Health Center and Lucas County Public Health continue to work together to distribute the COVID-19 vaccine as rapidly and efficiently as possible.
- We are currently focusing on phase 1B (including those age 65 and older.)
- Supply is still extremely limited and winter weather has caused more delays.
- Please be patient we are distributing the vaccines as quickly as they become available.
- Public Health is creating a "waiting list" for the county (LCHC does not have a list.) As more vaccines become available, the two entities will work together to work through this list. To get yourself or a loved one on this list, call Public Health at (641) 774-4312.
- Due to extreme shortage, LCHC is not currently giving vaccinations. This decision has been made to help ensure the county's weekly supply is distributed rapidly and efficiently.


